The offer of help:

If you or a member of your family has been diagnosed with Dementia, **Crossroads Care Bexley** may be able to help.

Our aim is to identify priority individuals within Bexley, who we can support with a package of personally tailored care.

Crossroads Care Bexley

Crossroads Care Bexley is a voluntary sector organisation and registered charity, and a regulated care provider that provides high quality care services, using trained staff to support people with care needs and their carers.

Dementia Project

Our Dementia project aims to provide services to anyone with Dementia – particularly those with early diagnosis.

This is a 3-year project funded by The City Bridge Trust.

It is a limited resource and people will be assessed and reviewed on an individual basis.



If you, or a family member, meet any of the following criteria, you may be eligible to receive support from us:

- ✓ You have been diagnosed as having Dementia, **or**
- ✓ You are the carer of a person diagnosed with Dementia, **and**
- ✓ You are **NOT** currently receiving any funded support services



Dementia can affect anyone. People that have Dementia experience a variety of difficulties, including memory loss, loss of daily living skills and confusion. The difficulties they face are individual. With early diagnosis and support, people can live independently in their own homes for longer.

Our Dementia project aims to offer a range of support from single sessions to more regular packages of care that are appropriate and culturally sensitive to needs.

Your help

An objective of our project is also to identify any gaps in service provision and to understand the barriers that may exist.

We would be very interested if you have experienced any barriers in receiving care services.

This could include:

- Eligibility criteria*
- Cultural issues
- Lack of appropriate services
- Lack of information
- ...or some other reason?



Crossroads Care Bexley will work with partner organisations and share this information, with your permission, to signpost and better support those with Dementia and their carers.
